Nitrile rubber, NBR

Recommended thickness of the material:  $\geq 0.4$  mm

The selection of the suitable gloves does not only depend on the material, but also on further marks of quality and varies from manufacturer to manufacturer. As the product is a preparation of several substances, the resistance of the glove material can not be calculated in advance and has therefore to be checked prior to the application.

· Penetration time of glove material

For the mixture of chemicals mentioned below the penetration time has to be at least 480 minutes (Permeation according to EN 16523-1:2015: Level 6).

The determined penetration times according to EN 16523-1:2015 are not performed under practical conditions. Therefore a maximum wearing time, which corresponds to 50% of the penetration time, is recommended.

The exact break through time has to be found out by the manufacturer of the protective gloves and has to be observed.
